Oregonians On Broadway

Joaquin Miller (1837-1913), playwright Wrote hit play *The Danites, or the Heart of the Sierras.* From Coburg.

Ballard MacDonald (1882-1935), lyricist

Wrote lyrics for George Gershwin, Victor Herbert, Walter Donaldson. From Portland.

George Olsen (1893-1971), bandleader

His band accompanied Eddie Cantor's Kid Boots and Whoopee. From Portland.

Lee Morse (1897-1954), singer-songwriter

Performed in Artists & Models Revue in 1923. Born in Cove.

Del Porter (1902 - 1977), singer-songwriter

Performed in the original Girl Crazy and Anything Goes. From Newberg.

Max Gordon (1903-1989), talent magnet

Opened Village Vanguard in 1935. Gave early gigs to Judy Holliday, Betty Comden & Adolph Green, Barbra Streisand, Pearl Bailey, Woody Allen, Lenny Bruce. From Portland.

Mayo Methot (1904-1951), actress

Appeared on the Broadway stage from 1923 to 1930. From Portland.

Caroline Burke Swann (1913-1964), producer

Backed plays by Herb Gardner, Paddy Chayefsky, Harold Pinter. From Portland.

Eileen Darby (1916-2004), photographer

One of the most respected photographers in Broadway history. From Portland.

Shelley Plimpton (b. 1947), actress

Originated Crissy in Hair. From Roseburg.
