## Harry Smith: Mid Century Oregon Genius

Born in Portland, Harry Smith (1923-1991) grew up in Bellingham & Anacortes, Washington. He learned to make films in San Francisco in 1946, moving to New York in the early 1950s. He lived and worked in New York the rest of his life, save his last three years, which he spent as Shaman In Residence at the Naropa Institute.

**Heaven And Earth Magic** was made in his apartment from 1957 to 1962. He made it entirely alone and by hand. He swore off animation after this, his only feature, complaining that it was too hard on his health.
