WHO is Mel Blanc?

Mel Blanc created the voices of Bugs Bunny, Porky Pig and Daffy Duck, and hundreds of other cartoon characters. He is the most respected voice artist in animation history.

WHERE did he come from?

He grew up in Portland, Oregon.

WHAT instruments did he play?

He played violin, viola, and sousaphone. He also played the ukulele.

HOW did he become a voice artist?

He was discovered playing a ukulele and singing with Herman Kenin's Multnomah Hotel Orchestra in 1927. The Hoot Owls, a Portland radio program, invited him to sing a novelty song on the air. Then he joined the show. He moved to LA in 1935, and began working in animation in 1937.

Q: WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE A VOICE MAN?

A: Mel Blanc said "CERTAINLY THE VOICE BOX'S ELASTICITY AND VERSATILITY. BUT JUST AS VITAL ARE THE **EARS** AND **BRAIN**.

THE EARS - TO BE ABLE TO CONSISTENTLY REPRODUCE THE SAME TIMBRES, TONES AND TEXTURES.

THE BRAIN - BECAUSE A VOICE ACTOR HAS TO BE KEENLY SENSITIVE WHEN IT COMES TO SHAPING EACH CHARACTER'S PERSONA."
